

TEACHING SUGGESTIONS

This game involves children in an important tactile activity that stimulates the curiosity, refines the senses, and promotes the learning of letters and words in a completely independent manner. Thanks to this teaching device, children can also learn to read and write when they are 3 years old.

1/ FISH FOR A LETTER

Give each player one or more Bingo cards, and put all the small shaped letters inside the little bag and mix them up. In turn, starting from the youngest player, and by helping themselves with touch perception, the children will fish out only one letter. If it is present on their cards, they win by positioning it above the corresponding letter. Otherwise, they must put it back in the bag and then give the turn to their individual opponent. The winner will be the player who first completes all the words.



2/ FISH OUT THREE SMALL LETTERS

Give each player one or more bingo cards; then put all the shaped letters inside the bag and mix them up. In turn, starting from the youngest player, the children – helping themselves with tactile perception – draw out 3 letters. If one, two or three of these are present on their cards, they win, and position them over the corresponding letters. Otherwise, they put them back in the bag and then pass the turn to their opponent. The winner is the player who first completes all the words.

3/ FISH OUT THE LETTERS

Give each player one or more bingo cards; then put all the shaped letters inside the bag and mix them up. In turn, starting from the youngest player, with the children helping themselves with tactile perception - withdraw four letters. If these are present on their cards, they choose only one and win it by positioning it above the corresponding letter. Otherwise they put the letters back in the bag and then pass the turn to their opponent. The winner is the player who first completes all the words.
