- Evaluate the effectiveness and impact of the project (for improving the quality of health services, development of human resources, the ability to manage the supply of services and projects as well as access to and use health insurance with health care ...);
- Recommend the lessons learned and recommendations on the appropriateness, effectiveness and sustainability of the project.

Scope of assessment

Assessment focuses on the content of the project components were implemented in 8 provinces of The south central coast (Da Nang City, Quang Nam, Quang Ngai, Binh Dinh, Phu Yen, Khanh Hoa, Ninh Thuan and Binh Thuan). This assessment is not conducted for the entire national health system in general

and the health system of the provincial project in particular. Besides, the project's evaluation process is in phase 6 years from 2008 to 2014. The figures may not be continuous, depending on the availability of information and data.

Methods of collecting information

Collect data using quantitative methods (data collection by filling patterns for individuals and units), combined with qualitative methods (interviews and group discussions on various objects) and gather information from reports and documents are available at all levels in the range of project activities. Handle and analyze the data using common methods usually applied today.
